His presentation could include information about the ecology of Barnegat Bay, including macro fauna; the biology and ecology of the Diamondback Terrapin; as well as educational issues and integrating Barnegat Bay into classroom curricula.

Mr. Wnek will travel to most areas within New Jersey to address Adult, College, High School, Middle School, and Elementary School groups. He is available weekday evenings and weekend afternoons. He does not require reimbursement for his travel expenses and there is no charge for his program.
